### How you can take part in the Pedestrian Summit

#### 1. Participate by providing resource information to attendees.

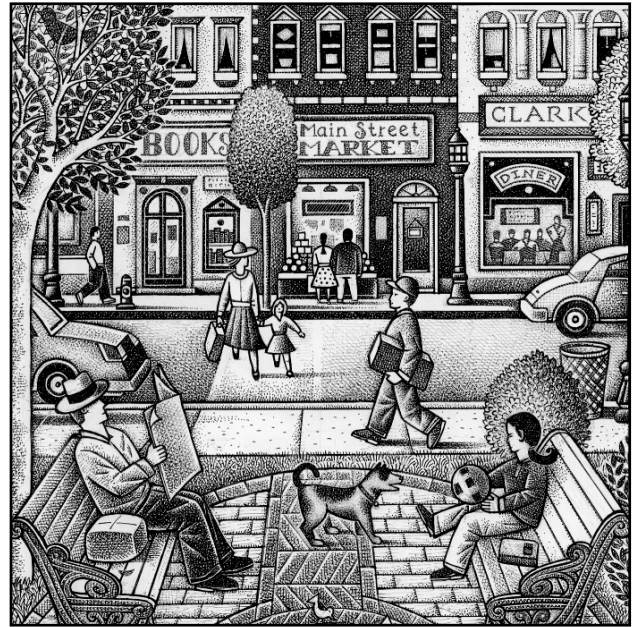
- we will have tables available at City Hall where you can provide a display and distribute materials on any programs or products you offer of interest to pedestrians. You'll need to set up at 8:30 am. We will have several breaks during the morning where attendees will be encouraged to visit with you.
- there is no charge for displaying at the Pedestrian Summit, but we do ask that you have at least one person available at your table during breaks to respond to questions about your program or business.
- we'll also include a 50-75 word description of your services in a resources packet we'll be distributing to all attendees.

#### 2. Be a sponsor and be recognized.

- as a sponsor you'll be contributing to the success of the 1<sup>st</sup> Burlington Pedestrian Summit. While we're operating on a limited budget, we do need to cover the costs of publicizing the Pedestrian Summit; reimbursing our keynote speaker and entertainers; and providing sandwiches & refreshments for attendees.
